





2021-2022 Findings

- 6 out of 10 teachers think the program has benefitted the student a lot or a great deal.
- 7 out of 10 teachers are very or extremely satisfied with the communication they receive from the ELP.






Teachers who Agree or Strongly Agree the ELP has:

- helped improve student's level of class participation.


- helped student complete homework assignments with fewer mistakes.


All students - Improvement in engagement in learning 2021-22
